

**PROJECT MANAGEMENT PROFESSIONAL (PMP) – 10 DAYS
(March 17 to May 24, 2008)**

Objectives

The objectives of this course are to: (1) Reinforce the use of modern project management methods and standards with the ultimate objective of improving economic performance in the planning, management and monitoring of development projects and programmes; and (2) Provide course participants with a basis for international accreditation as Project Management Professionals (PMP's) by the Project Management Institute (PMI).

Overview

The course begins with an overview of the project management framework and standards for project management of a project. The remainder of the course delves into specific elements of this framework in much more detail. These lectures culminate in a mock exam and the end of the lectures.

Who Should Attend This Programme?

The course is designed for persons who have responsibility for:

1. Managing projects in the Public Sector – social, economic and physical development projects.
2. Installation of new plant and equipment at Utility Companies, Manufacturing sector and Mining.
3. Large multifaceted projects, such as ICT Consultants.
4. Specialist projects, such as Civil Engineers and Architects.
